

COVID-19 CONTROL MEASURES

In light of the current COVID-19 situation, we have amended our process to maintain the safety of our employees, contractors and occupants of the buildings we work in.

The following general rules are now in place on any SRAP painting / remedial project.

- All workers on our sites are to confirm that they have not personally been or have been in contact with anybody returning from overseas in the last 14 days.
- Anybody with flu like symptoms is not to attend the work site and is to present themselves to their doctor or a COVID-19 testing centre as per current government advice.
- All workers are to maintain at least 1.5m between each other where possible.
- Shaking hands is discouraged.
- Any physical contact is discouraged.
- · Sharing tools is discouraged.
- Work areas will be expanded to provide adequate separation between workers and the public.
- Masks will be worn in internal areas.
- A maximum density of 1 person per 4m2 internally to be maintained.
- Hand Sanitiser is available in site vehicles and where applicable within our site compounds.

The following Site-specific controls are in place:

- All painting works to facades and balconies will be completed externally with no internal access required. Landing areas will be barricaded as per standard practice.
- Gloves and masks will be worn whilst working externally at ground floor.
- All employees and contractors will be encouraged to download and use the Australian Government COVID Safe smartphone app.

We require vigilance from occupants of the buildings we are working in. We request the following is undertaken by occupants to ensure safety is maintained.

- Windows and doors are to remain closed when facades or balconies are being worked on.
- All personal property, furniture, plants etc are removed from balconies to ensure contact is minimized.
